Hello Sandee,

I am writing in support of the conversion of 2 tennis courts at Duck Pond into 6 additional Pickleball Courts. I have been an avid player for 6 years and I moved to Simi Valley 4 years ago, and the people as well as my participation in pickleball had a real impact on my decision to move here.

I am a national level player and have medalled in the US National Pickleball championships. I am also a tournament director and started the current Santa Barbara American Riviera tournament as well as the Simi Valley Town Crown tournament, which I have run for two years prior to COVID.

With the participation growing consistently over my last 4 years in Simi Valley, I can honestly say that the growth and increase in participation is creating some heated arguments based on the lack of courts. We have seen this problem grow here in Simi Valley every year, and it will only get worse because the number of new players is growing exponentially as more residents/players tell their friends about the fun they are having.

This is the time for NEW COURTS. I cannot run effective tournaments at the Sinaloa middle school location because they only allow Saturdays and Sundays for court use. That does not support a tournament that attracts 300+ participants. We need Friday as well and the school will not allow that. Additionally, the school supervisors change over time and we get on and off support depending on their position regarding pickleball support. We cannot plan effectively under those circumstances. Running tournaments brings in hundreds of people from out of town which brings in significant revenue for Simi Valley in hotel stays and restaurant/food sales. With 6 new courts WITH LIGHTS we can run very successful tournaments and not worry about school rules and having to be done before it gets dark.

I love tennis and played many years, however, I do not see the numbers compared to pickleball. We are filling up ALL 12 courts at the middle school on Saturdays with people waiting and weekdays on Tuesday and Thursday at Duck Pond, cannot support those numbers on 6 courts. That is where the arguments are occurring. We have been asking for these courts for 3 years now and in that time the numbers have continued to grow and there is no reason to think that they will not continue to grow for years to come. We need to accommodate the growth now!

Please forward my support to the appropriate party. If you have any questions or require any additional insight from a professional level player and tournament director feel free to reach out.

As it is, we do not have enough tennis courts at the local parks, and the pickleball players have access to rolling nets, should they want to play.

Hello Simi Board Members,

My name.. Gary Gossett. I'm a long time resident of Simi Vally an avid pickleball player, certified coach and an Ambassador for USA Pickleball representing Simi Valley. I've been teaching pickleball for over five years and have watched this crazy game grow from a recreational pass time to an obsession of the masses. Pickleball is definitely here to stay and, so it brings me to fill you folks in on what's been happening within our community over the past several years.

Your own records will show that every seven to eight weeks or so about 24 new players are inducted into Simi Valley's ever growing pickleball community via lessons sponsored by RSRPD. On the conservative side that's around 175 new players each year added to the over 500-600 plus players that play in Simi on a regular basis. While this interest and excitement for the game is exploding it's quite obvious that Simi doesn't have enough courts to accommodate all the players. We are MAXED OUT!

So, what's the solution? The solution in the short term would be to convert 2 more tennis courts (next to the existing pickleball courts at Duck Pond) into 6 additional courts. This will open up many avenues for additional RSRPD revenues and would better service the community with 12 dedicated and lighted pickleball courts at Duck Pond Park. A discussion to build a 12-16 court pickleball facility at Wood Ranch could be brought up at a later date.
